### What has worked well?

- Online submission being adopted across institution (University of Edinburgh)
- GradeMark well received (QMU)
- Core/essential skills test made in QMP (North East Scotland college)
- Rubrics for Internet Safety assignment (North East Scotland college)
- Rubrics for Journal grading (University of Stirling)
- WebBA (University of Edinburgh)
- Exceptions for AAA students (University of Stirling)
- Immediate Feedback from tests (QMU)
- Saved comments in GradeMark (Abertay University)
- Improved student response to feedback (Glasgow Caledonian)
- Transfer of questions between modules (University of Stirling)
- Less paper, legible feedback (Abertay University)
- Use of Rubrics (Glasgow Caledonian)
- Formative Testing popular (Abertay University)

### What has worked less well?

- Over-reliance on MCQ testing (University of Stirling)
- Turnitin unreliable, support poor (University of Stirling)
- Checking who's submitted when assignment is anonymous (University of Edinburgh)
- Problems in-test - high stakes issues (University of Stirling and North East Scotland College)
- Turnitin unreliable, support poor (University of Edinburgh)
- Offline marking from home (Glasgow Caledonian)
- Anonymous/Delegated grading not supported in Turnitin workflow (University of Edinburgh)
- Anonymity of marking (QMU)
- Staff training poorly attended (University of Stirling)
- GradeMark not accepting letter grades or decimal point grades (Abertay University)
- GradeMark group submission limitations (QMU)

### Things we'd like to see

- Greater Turnitin integration with Blackboard – currently have to choose between Turnitin workflow or Blackboard Assignment Tool workflow
- Better Turnitin reliability
- Turnitin able to handle extensions for selected students
- Increased size of criterion field in Grading Form
- Group submissions in GradeMark
- Issues with anonymity - Hard to see who has not submitted when assignments are anonymous
- Chance to enter different types of grades in GradeMark
- Email confirmation of assignments submitted via Blackboard Assignment Tool
- Ability to return marked assignments within Blackboard Assignment Tool - to facilitate offline marking (OU can do this)
- Offline GradeMark with synching
